Why is Voting Important?

For black and individual of color communities, voting is extremely important since it is a key instrument for social change and empowerment. Throughout history, underprivileged communities have persistently battled for the right to vote, understanding that while systematic injustices requires tackling political engagement. Voting gives these groups the ability to shape laws pertaining to criminal justice, healthcare, education, and employment prospects, according to the Brennan Center for Justice. Additionally, the NAACP stresses that voting gives people the power to accountability from their representatives and create a more just society. Black and Minority communities claim their voices in the political process by voting, which promotes better representation and advocacy for their needs.

In collaboration with the Athens Clarke County government, we've initiated Community Benefit Agreements and supported four workers with legal claims. Our center serves as a vital hub for empowering non-unionized, low-wage workers, especially those from historically marginalized groups like Black. Latinx. and immigrant communities in Athens, Georgia, and surrounding areas.

Worker centers play a crucial role in fostering economic justice by offering education, organizing opportunities, leadership development, and advocacy.

Our efforts include partnering with local unions, lawyers, and organizations, connecting workers with resources, and championing policies for fair wages and improved working conditions. By addressing underlying issues contributing to financial hardships, we aim to create a more resilient community.

Membership at the Workers Center is open to all, regardless of their ability to pay dues. However, dues-paying members participate in decision-making processes, shaping the center's direction.
